## Sno-Fest committee has big plans for the weekend of June 17 and 18

**Marmora and Lake** - This year, the Sno-fest Committee is holding a "Use to B" Art Show in conjunction with their car show and flea market on the weekend of June 17 and 18. The committee is hoping to attract those with flair and ingenuity to submit their art pieces in this, the first art show of its kind in our area. While there are only two categories this year, it is hoped that this idea will take off and become a popular feature for future years.

A Recycled Art piece can be made from anything reused, recycled, salvaged, scrounged, found, or otherwise saved from landfills, dumpsters, scrap yards, yard/garage sales, flea markets, garages, sheds, or your neighbour's old barn. Art may be

free standing or a wall hanging, but it must contain 85 per cent recycled material for category one or 75 per cent material from nature for the second category. For example in the nature category, it could be a print design using natural dyes and potatoes. A garden sculpture using old car parts is just one idea for the recycled category. Each piece should be named and accompanied by a brief description of the material used. Even though there is no cost to enter, all entries must be submitted by 10 a.m. on June 17 to the Sno-fest yard sale building at the arena. There will be three prizes awarded in each category with judging taking place at noon the following day. The Auto Show will be on Saturday, June 17, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Fairgrounds, with prizes and a People's Choice award trophy for best auto.

New this year is the first annual Die Cast Challenge, with 1:64 scale vehicles for enthusiasts of all ages. Vehicles go down a 16-foot ramp, (starting with a three-foot elevation declining for eight feet, then flat for eight feet), up to eight racers at a time, with three categories: cars, trucks and other (e.g. boats, tractors, etc.). This will take place on Sunday, June 18, in the arena or area, with registration from 10 a.m., and races starting at noon.

We also have the 1:64 scale Shine and Show "Diorama," with up to ten cars in a variety of settings at the invention of their creators, e.g., car dealer show, a junk yard, or down-town Marmora, etc. Entrants will be judged on appearance, complexity and over-all scale. There will be attractive prizes.

There will also be a large Sno-Fest Yard Sale, both days, Saturday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sunday from 8 to 4. Donations will gratefully accepted. Call and leave a message with Robert Young for pickup, or to book your vendor's spot at the Flea Market.
